Of the 2.4 million Christians in Pakistan, around 60%* are illiterate. Despised for their faith, they are often viewed merely as a source of very cheap or bonded menial labour. For over 20 years the mission of Starfish Asia has been to see the destinies of these Christians in Pakistan changed - through education. And that change is happening. Children, previously destined to chop bamboo, be domestic servants, clean sewers or make bricks are now on the same higher education courses as their Muslim peers.

The Leaders Making Change Happen

In the peaceful hills of Khanspur, Ayubia, leaders of independent schools from across the Starfish Pakistan family gathered for a powerful week of training, reflection and transformation (above). In a culture where suspicion and disunity pervades even the Christian community, these leaders unite for prayer, fellowship and skills equipping before facing the struggles of another term.

What are their daily lives like? How does such an event help? What changes are they seeing in their communities? For Christians in Pakistan, increased hope and achievement often comes with increased hardship and persecution. Read on to see how your support is helping us to **stand** alongside these leaders, **strengthen** their faith and see them start to **overcome** deep-rooted prejudice.



Not Alone



In conversation with a number of project leaders, following the training retreat, a number of themes developed when asked about their daily lives and the challenges they face in their schools. These stories remind us that Christianeducationin Pakistanis not just about textbooks and class rooms—it's about resilience, faith, and the unwavering belief that every child deserves the chance to learn.

Standing up against adversity.

You may remember Ruth, the amazing project leader we featured in 2022 who travels through the bamboo plantation on her motorbike to oversee two schools, **St.Peters and St.Pauls.** 15 years ago, parents saw no point in education; just as they laboured to harvest bamboo, so would their children. But Ruth knew then that things could be different.

Starfish provided teacher training, salary support and textbooks and Ruth's persistance over the years is bearing fruit. A new generation of literate Christians are now going on to higher education, and former pupils are working in the police, as

engineers, lab technicians and a physiotherapist.

But now a new set of challenges have emerged. The peaceful coexistence that had prevailed for years in the community has been disturbed, and jealousy grows. Who is going to cut the bamboo if Christians are going off to university? Why should "they" be able to study with "our" children? These questions give rise to anger and now direct threats to the worshipping community. Ruth tells how last year it was impossible to celebrate their usual Christmas at the local village Church. In fact they no longer feel safe to use the building at all, and Christians must gather in homes.

This isn't an isolated case. We hear similar stories from almost all project leaders of discrimination. Freedom and opportunity here is limited, and very much favours the majority. We may not be able to change that, but we certainly MUST stand with our brothers and sisters to face a hardening climate.

Strengthening leaders in faith and skills.

How do Christian communities become stronger and more resilient in the face of persecution, discrimination and pressure to convert? A sound theological foundation increases confidence and faith. Did you know there are currently over 300 teachers receiving weekly discipleship through the Open Theological Seminary, supported by Starfish Asia? The training deepens understanding of scripture, fosters a closer relationship with God, and develops spiritual gifts, helping to strengthen the teachers' faith and, in turn, impact the children.

Samuel, a teacher from Kingdom of Heaven, told us what OTS has done for him: "I came to know the priceless love of God and understood faith better. Compassion for others and humility and modesty were also born in my heart. As a teacher, my life and teaching also improved. I teach and instruct children in the light of the Holy Scriptures."

We thank God that Mike Wakely had the vision to create a Bible-based curriculum delivered each week to 8,000 children in Starfish supported schools. He still updates this today (see pg4). We thank God that Mike also researched and wrote "The Amazing Story of Pakistan's Christians" being used to provide historic underpinning for older children. These publications play a vital role in raising a new generation of Christians who persist against the odds.

The project leaders all agree that their connection with Starfish provides a huge benefit beyond financial support. Access to good teacher training, the network with other schools and leaders, the OTS provision and bible curriculum give these small, independent schools a sense of security and help drive them forward and overcome even the hardest challenges.

"I always say.... that Starfish is just like a hive of the bees... we are the bees, the leaders, and the project heads... We come together, we bring our abilities and capacities, and we join that hive [to] produce a honey which can change the lives of the children of our






Building Confidence, Inspiring Change

In addition to the Project Leaders' retreat, Starfish Pakistan planned and organised five regional teachers' training courses in July 2025, bringing together 161 dedicated teachers from Lahore, Faisalabad, Gujranwala and Multan. They received a number of subject-focused sessions from expert facilitators: Mr. Shakeel Earnest (Science and Maths), Mr. Karamat Adeel (Urdu), and Ms. Caroline (Basic English).

These passionate tutors went above and beyond, ensuring each concept was understood, not just via presentations, but also with real-time classroom scenarios and practical engagement. Feedback was positive and encouraging.

This training is part of our commitment to building stronger, more confident educators who can inspire change in their classrooms and communities.





CONGRATULATIONS!

The year 10 national exam results (for the Punjab) were released in August. We rejoice that there is a slight improvement in scores from last year, although noted a fall in numbers who sat the exams (76 compared to 103 last year) The overall pass rate (pass in ALL subjects) was 64%, while 50% passed with Grade C or above. Given the poor background of these students, and the large drop-out rate after year 5, it is something to rejoice in!

On the outskirts of Lahore, Anam runs the **Voice of Children School.** She tells of the struggles they had due to being an independent school, but how being linked with Starfish Pakistan has helped them in various ways, not least by experiencing the fellowship at training events and being reminded of key educational tools. She has worked hard to build up the parents' understanding of the importance of education and now notices a sea-change in their commitment and dedication which is passed on to their children. The older pupils even attended school for a couple of hours throughout the summer so that they would have enough time to complete the curriculum and revise for the matriculation exams!

It's hard, but parents are determined. Most of the mothers work as maids in rich households. One said to Anam "I realised that my children have the same bodies, organs and brains as the children in the house where I work. The only difference is the rich have an education." Today, the children of domestic servants are passing exams. With Starfish scholarships they are going on to mainstream further and higher education. The destiny of Christian minority children in this village is no longer fixed. Anam is excited to see what they do next!


